Building & Grounds -

The building continues to be used by a great variety of groups. The church will also be hosting a religious movie night in January for the South Central Region of the CT Episcopal church. More information to come.

Outreach & Mission -The Diocesan Mission Committee meets monthly at St Paul's in Wallingford. Planning for the March 2019 Diocesan Mission Conference is currently underway. The Global Mission Conference will take place in the Dominican Republic in April 2019. Christ and The Epiphany is currently supporting Women of Madagascar under the leadership of Jacky Lowe with SAMS: Kateri (Nigeria) under the leadership of the Rev. Tom Furrer (ret.); and Guinea under the leadership of the Rev. Charles Kamano. The Global Mission Fund has adequate monies to send \$500.00 to Women of Madagascar and Kateri. Per Vestry approval we mailed donation barrels to Guinea. We are behind in our goal to establish 501(c) 3 status for the Guinea Mission. A maximum goal of reaching three missions is optimal, and we have close contact with each.

Worship - Bible Study has steady attendance. Focus is preparation for healing ministry. Study text is foundational writing of Francis MacNutt, the central work of healing in the

Many thanks to the Food Pantry volunteers who helped us bring our Christmas items from the garage to our Christmas Room.

In return, there were some of us who helped the Food Pantry sort the tremendous amount of food brought in from food drives by the Boy Scouts, the Police Department, and the Knights of Columbus. We have a wonderful relationship with the great people who make up the East Haven Food Pantry.

The Thrift Store brought in \$746.04 for October, bringing the year total to \$7,026.85.

The Global Mission Fund brought in \$132.00 for October, bringing the total to \$1,434.74. We gave Charles \$360 to ship his barrels.

Backpack Program Kathy Alison

The Backpack Program is affiliated with the East Haven Food Pantry and was established in 2016. The Superintendent of Schools provides the East Haven Food Pantry with the number of children at each school who is a recipient of reduced or free meals at school. Currently the program services 96 children.

The volunteers meet every other Wednesday to assemble bags that consist of milk, juice, breakfast, lunch, and snacks. The bags are then delivered to each school the following day and stored at the nurse's office. At the end of the week each child stops by the nurse's office where the bags are discretely placed in the backpack to avoid the possibility of any embarrassment.

The Christ and The Epiphany volunteers presently consist of Ken and Kathy Dougherty, Barbara Parsons, Astrid Swanson, Michael Neeley, and myself.

We decided to focus on contributing our time along with a fruit (apple sauce) and cheese sandwich crackers since peanut butter crackers may adversely affect those with a peanut allergy. Any donations of these items will go directly to this program and are very much appreciated.

Dear Companions in Christ:

Once again, sadly, during our 2018 Annual Convention of the Episcopal Church in Connecticut, we were called to pause and pray for victims of violence whose lives were in the process of being senselessly taken by individuals intent on spreading terror and hatred. The first time we stopped to pray for such was November 13, 2015 during the Paris terrorist attacks. And then last Saturday, as we met in Convention in Mystic, we paused yet again to pray for the victims of the horrific shooting in the Tree of Life synagogue shooting in Pittsburgh. Such madness has got to stop.

As founding bishops and ongoing participants in the Bishops United Against Gun Violence (BUAGV) network, we commend to you our BUAGV letter in response to the Tree of Life shooting. We urge you to take our words to heart and then work with us to end the scourge of hatred, anti-Semitism, and gun violence in our nation.

Our prayers go out to the bereaved and all whose lives were taken on Saturday at the Tree of Life synagogue.
