to identify with the poor and
downtrodden as God does?

God with Us. Lay hold of that abundant life the Child of Bethlehem came to give you that is full of peace, joy, and contentment. "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest" (Matt. 11:28)

It wasn't quite the forty years the Israelites wandered in the wilderness, but it was certainly more than thirty. That's how long it took me to hear what God had been telling me all along - that I

needed to be a member of a church family.

I was raised, baptized, confessed, confirmed and married in the Roman Catholic Church. As an adult, I "religiously" avoided church. I didn't feel comfortable attending because I disagreed with so many of the church's policies and prohibitions. I only darkened the doorstep for funerals, weddings and the occasional Christmas and Easter services. Going to church was an onerous obligation. So, I stopped. And by rejecting one denomination, I rejected all, because, strangely, it felt disloyal to the Catholic Church to attend another.


And then Newtown

senseless tragedy, I
discussed it with my family,
my co-workers, and
members of my artist
group. But I needed
something more - more
support, more
understanding, more
prayer; another type of
community to share sorrow
and explore ways to heal.
I needed a worshipping
community.

Ten days after the Sandy Hook shooting, on Christmas Eve, 2012, I attended my first worship service at Christ and The Epiphany. I enjoyed the service; it was close enough to the Catholic Mass so that I could follow the flow and I learned how to juggle the bulletin, the BCP and the Hymnal. Instead of a sermon, Father Stan led a heart-warming discussion with the children in front of the altar about the meaning of Christmas. The songs of the season soared throughout the sanctuary and the church bell was

rung. I drove home with grateful tears in my eyes.

I had found a worshipping community.

Attending church was no longer a debt paid for a positive check mark on my eternal permanent record. It became a pleasure and privilege to worship God in prayer and song with those who welcomed me so warmly. To share grief, to offer comfort, to rejoice in the joy of others.

I became a member of a worshipping community.

Almost five years later, I decided to make it official. It was my great honor and joy to be received into the Episcopal Church on November 30, 2017 at St. Andrew the Apostle Church in Rocky Hill. When Bishop Laura Ahrens said to me, "Welcome home," I knew I already was.

Thanks to God, who, when I was finally ready to listen, pointed me to Christ and The Epiphany. Thank you to all who welcomed me and made me feel appreciated and treasured. Thank you to all who patiently answered my questions and forgave my mistakes. Thank you to all my brothers and sisters in Christ at Christ and The Epiphany Church.

I am home.
