ECCT Spring Training Report

In April, the Episcopal Church in CT (ECCT) holds its annual Spring Training day. This is a day of workshops for all ECCT churches. We were fortunate that almost our entire Vestry was able to attend this year! We likely had one of the largest turnouts for a single

church. There were 308 attendees from 88 parishes around the state. Our group attended a total of 20 different workshops. Note that attendance is not limited to Vestry members so consider joining our group next year! Here is a summary from those who were able to go:

Wendy Bellmore -

"Meditation, Movement, and Music" were presented through a Yoga and meditation exercise, followed by a meditative humming that ended in song. We actually sounded like a choir! Very relaxing and a great way to start off the workshop day. The "Stephen Ministry" is a ministry of listening and friendship that is different from the Parish Visitor or Healing Prayer roles. Trained Stephen ministers are assigned to a hurting, grieving or distressed person in need of talking through the difficulty they might be facing. Lastly, I attended the "Religious Pilgrimage" workshop which gave an overview of the many sites of religious pilgrimage throughout the world, and across many different faiths. Emphasis given to the Anglican work being done in the Holy Land, building schools, supporting hospitals and empowering women.

Jan Cianelli - My first workshop talked about how bringing religion to children starts at home by helping parents have simple reading materials to read their children. "Making Church Fun and Building Community" showed us that we certainly do everything that the larger parishes do with far less funds and parishioners. I am SO proud of Christ and The Epiphany for all we do with so little! At the Youth Ministry workshop, I was hoping to find ways to get more youths involved but that was not the focus of the workshop. However, I did get some ideas we could move forward with once we confirm we have the resources to do so!

Rev. Charles Kamano - I attended three workshops: 1) Morning Prayer; 2) Vestry; and 3) Living Community. The Vestry workshop captured my attention the most. I learned that Vestry is Mission-focused in the Episcopal Church. Serving as a Vestry member is an *"important, challenging, rewarding, and fulfilling work, which requires a vast array of skills and abilities from a diverse group of people who are faithful, committed, and open to the Spirit."* Each Vestry member is a steward of God's Mission within and outside the Parish. It is a commitment to sharing one's gifts and talents for the advancement of God's Mission (Cor. 12:4-12 NRSV). It was also enriching for me to learn about a variety of realities from other Parishes within the ECCT.

Carol Link-Ude - In the "Lay Leadership" workshop I

learned something new - i.e. the importance of mentoring others in the congregation to assume leadership positions. This would make a smooth transfer of responsibility from one leader to another.

Barbara Parsons - Spring training inspired and encouraged me to be an effective leader. Two of my workshops "Pathways to Prayer" and "The Soul: A User's Manual" encouraged me spiritually. My third workshop "Vestry 301" was helpful in showing me ways to better encourage good communication practices. It was a great day for fun and fellowship.

Susan Shultz - "Digital Media and Marketing" gave me some great ideas on ways to enhance our communication both in and outside of the church. The Stewardship workshop was also inspiring. Lastly, I am pleased to report that we only missed one of the Financial Good Practices Merit Badges and only because our 2017 audit was late.

Diane Villano - The Rt. Rev. Ian Douglas was a former seminary professor and it was an educational joy to attend his workshop on Morning Prayer. He thoroughly explained the flow of the service in the Book of Common Prayer and explained much of the obscure terminology. With some encouragement, I might one day be persuaded to lead Morning Prayer. Of immediate value to me was the workshop "The Foyer Has Moved: Welcoming & Inviting People to Your Church in the Digital Age". I filled an entire

As the 2018-2019 Metropolitan Opera season draws to a close this May, there are still a few operas left. One is Wagner's final opera on April 27th best known as "Götterdämmerung". In May Bizet's "The Pearl Fisherman" will be a pre-recorded broadcast. To close the season, the Met is presenting a powerful opera based on the French Revolution and Religion called "The Dialogues des Carmelites" by Francis Poulenc.

In September of 2019 the Metropolitan will open with the production of Gershwin's "Porgy and Bess". Following that in November will be a premiere gala of Philip Glass' "Akhenaten". In January will be Alban Berg's "Wozzeck"

with Peter Matte singing the starring role. Lastly look for Wagner's "The Flying Dutchman" starting in March 2020.

With so many new and exciting productions there are still the beloved ones such as Tosca, Manon Lescaut, and Simon Boccanegra. Check with your local movie theatres and radio broadcasts for a listing of the times and dates.
