### Education for Ministry (EfM)

#### Diane Villano

I have almost completed my first year in the Education for Ministry program, a four-year course of study administered by the School of Theology of the University of the South in Sewanee, Tennessee. This is not an ordination program; it's geared to developing the lay minister and exploring how one can serve others.

From efm.sewanee.edu:
Every baptized person is called to ministry. The Education for Ministry (EfM) program provides people with the education to carry out that ministry. During the Service of Confirmation, we ask God to "Renew in these your servants the covenant you made with them at Baptism. Send them forth in the power of the Spirit to perform the service you set

before them." EfM offers an opportunity to discover how to respond to the call to Christian service. The seminar group is the nucleus of the Education for Ministry program. A group consists of six to twelve participants and a trained mentor who meet weekly over the course of a nine-month academic year. These meetings are usually from two and a half to three hours in length. Through **study**, **prayer**, and reflection, EfM groups move toward a new understanding of the fullness of God's kingdom.

Each year can be taken separately, and seminars meet around the state. I'm part of the group meeting at Church of the Epiphany in Durham, and we meet every Monday evening. Currently, we are sharing our reading and insights via Zoom. Because the Episcopal Church in Connecticut is a sponsor, we can join at a discounted price. If you are interested in learning more about this program, please let me know.

### Bible Study Wendy Bellmore

Over the last 3 years we have been traveling in the sandals of Jesus, first learning and discussing the concept of healing of body, mind, and spirit. We read the synoptic Gospels Matthew, Mark and Luke, and then the Gospel of John. In those readings, we explored Jesus' mission to bring us back to God, to repent our sins and reconcile our relationship with God, and to emulate Jesus by going out in mission to preach the Gospel, and heal the sins and

brokenness in this world. We then followed the apostles in Acts, to see how they were able to sustain and uphold the work given to them, and all of us, by Jesus.

This year, have we returned to the prophets, starting our study with Isaiah and Jeremiah, and will be closing with Ezekiel. We are finding and discussing the consistency of our loving Gods message to be present with his people, to forgive our sin, and to reconcile our relationship, all this many hundreds of years before the time of Jesus. From there, we hope to explore and discuss the book of Revelation, a vision of judgement of the righteous and the wicked.

While we all have been put on hold in quarantine, our Bible study was also suspended, and discussion among some participants indicates that, now that we are mostly able to use Zoom successfully, we might consider a weeknight Bible study, or perhaps Wednesday evenings. Please contact Wendy Bellmore, or Warden Barbara Parsons if you are interested.

Another Bible study option is to follow along with Trinity, Wethersfield, with Father Tom Furrer, director of Kateri, our mission to Nigeria. On Thursdays during the day, they post a prerecorded video on their website and get together via Zoom for discussion. Please visit their website for more information:

## **Episcopal Church in Connecticut (ECCT)**

Excerpts from the latest ECCT Clergy and Lay Leaders Communication: COVID-19 Update #8: April 17, 2020

Dear Clergy and Wardens in the Episcopal Church in Connecticut:

Alleluia! Christ is Risen!

We want to begin with a word of thanks. Thank you, and thanks be to God, for your faithful leadership as we continue to do all that we can to mitigate and suppress the spread of COVID-19. We have been moved by the many creative ways you have led your parishes in online worship throughout Holy Week and the wonderful celebration of the Resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ on Easter Day. Thank you also for your faithfulness in trying to keep your other ministries going, especially those ministries with individuals and families struggling with food and housing insecurity. Your dedication to God's mission in your neighborhoods is inspiring.

On Friday, April 10, Governor Ned Lamont signed his Executive Order No 7X. https://portal.ct.gov/-/media/Office-of-the-Governor/Executive-Orders/LamontExecutive-Orders/Executive-Order-No-7X.pdf
This Order extends the closing of schools, restaurants, bars, malls, fitness facilities, and other "non-essential business" through May 20, 2020. It also extends the prohibition of public, in-person gatherings of more than five people until May 20, 2020. In our Update #3 of March 20, 2020 we strongly urged parishes to be closed at least through May 10 in keeping with the guidelines of the Center for Disease Control. While religious institutions are not mentioned in the Governor's extension of closures through May 20, we believe it is our civic duty to also keep our churches closed through May 20, 2020. Therefore, please extend the closure of your parishes from May 10 to May 20, 2020. If you do need to enter your church buildings for urgent matters to help keep the parish running, please observe the direction not to gather in groups of more than five individuals while also practicing a safe distance perimeter and wearing facial masks to prevent the spread of respiratory droplets. The Commons will remain closed for in-person meetings through May 20, 2020 while ECCT staff continue to work from home.

It might seem self-evident, but it is important to note that spring confirmations in our Regions will also be cancelled through at least May 20, 2020 and probably beyond. We are currently looking at our calendars and are hoping to find time in the fall for Region confirmations.

Finally, we know that your ongoing efforts to mitigate the spread of the coronavirus, coupled with the realty of sickness and death from COVID-19 and other illnesses of those in your care, will continue to cause an increased burden on you as clergy and lay leaders. We urge you, as we do regularly, please take care of yourself. The best thing we can do for others is to stay healthy and whole so that we can be the priests, pastors, and leaders that our parishes need today and into the future. Please do not hesitate to reach out us at any time as we want to do all in our power to support you. You are in our daily prayers for strength, safety, endurance, and health. God bless you all.
